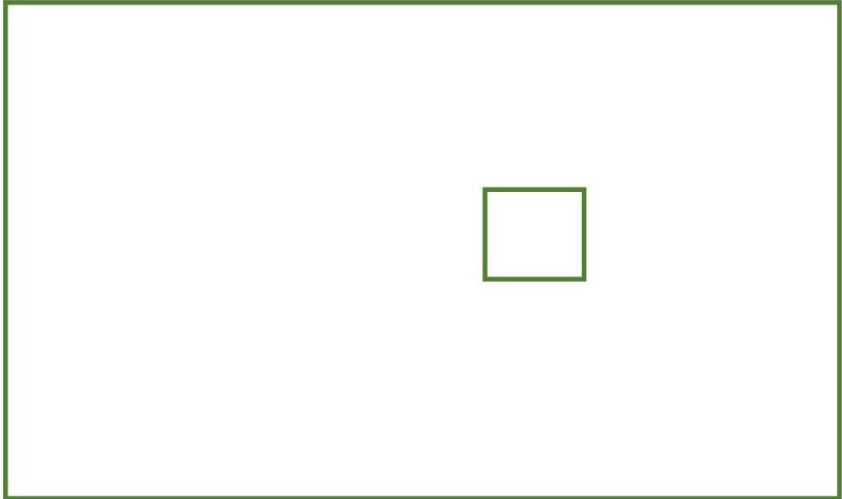


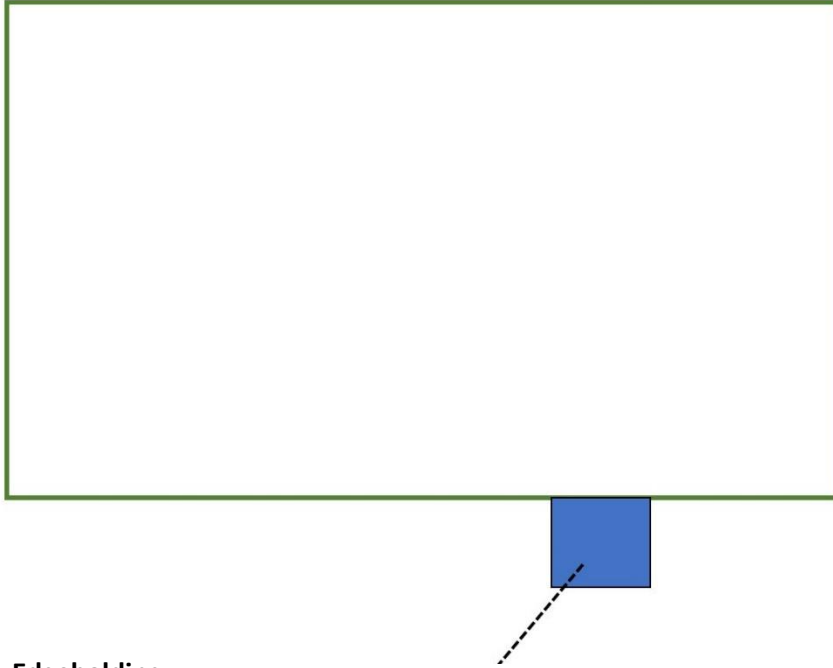
Inholding

Non-federal land within the boundary of a wilderness area. Some may have established routes that provide access, some may not. Access provisions in Section 5(a) of the Wilderness Act only apply to inholdings that are completely surrounded by federal wilderness lands. Acquisition provisions apply the same to all inholdings.



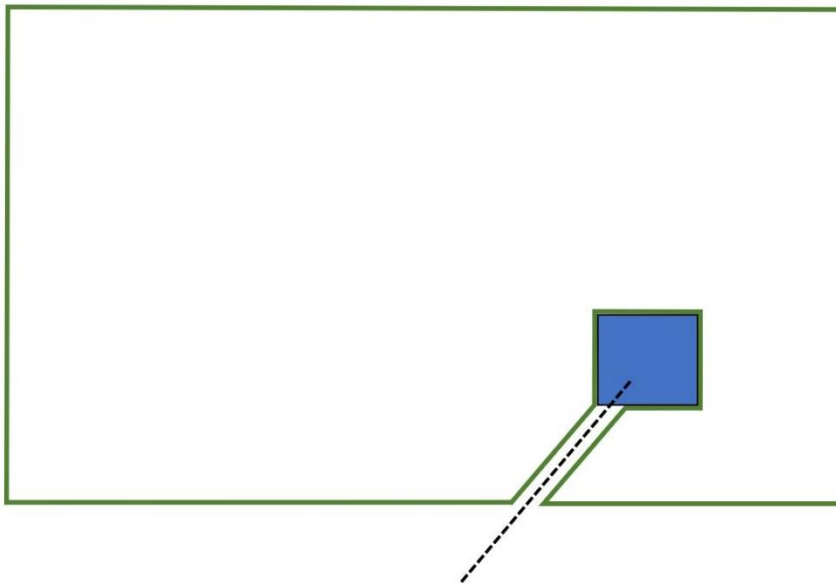
Wilderness exclusion area

Non-wilderness federal land that is surrounded by wilderness. Although rare, these may exist to exclude uses incompatible with wilderness designation or as the result of wilderness expansions. No special access provisions exist for these areas.



Edgeholding

Non-federal land adjacent to but not within the boundaries of a wilderness area. Unless a special provision or ROW exists, access to these properties does not pass over the wilderness. Acquisition of these properties can occur through donation, and the wilderness boundary is modified to include them.



Cherrystem Edgeholding

An edgeholding that is at the end of a road (or other non-wilderness corridor) that is mostly surrounded by wilderness, except for the non-wilderness corridor. These are managed as any other edgeholding.
