SEQUENCE OF BASIC JOB STEPS	POTENTIAL HAZARDS UNSAFE ACTS OR CONDITIONS	RECOMMENDED ACTION OR PROCEDURE
Foot travel to field sites	Coming upon animals not known to be present (e.g. elk calves or deer fawns in riparian shrubs)	Use established trails or areas in open vegetation types to the extent possible; avoid heavy shrubs. Identify alternate escape routes to the extent possible. Walk slowly and make plenty of noise to alert animals to your presence. Use extra caution during mating and birthing seasons Carry and be prepared to use pepper spray. Carry a park radio.
