HAZARDS	ACTIONS TO ELIMINATE HAZARDS Specify safe work procedures and personal protective equipment
PERSONAL PROTECTION EQUIPMENT (PPE) REQUIRED AS CONDITION OF EMPLOYMENT AND PROVIDED BY THE EMPLOYEE	REVIEW HIRING PAPERS FOR FULL LIST OF PPE REQUIRED FOR EMPLOYMENT (IE: 8" HIGH LEATHER BOOTS WITH NON-SLIP SOLES, CUFFLESS TROUSERS, LONG SLEEVE SHIRT SUITED TO WORK, ETC.) JHA may specify additional or different PPE.
Collision with logging trucks, other vehicles and other objects (rocks, trees, animals)	Seat belts required, drive at safe speeds, defensive driving, pull off road if possible, keep windows clear keep safe following distance especially on dirt roads.
Backing accident	Keep windows and mirrors clear, use mirror and assistant when possible, walk behind vehicle.
Flying objects from passing or leading vehicle	Keep safe following distance, pull off road and stop if possible, safe speed.
Bruises, cuts, burns while in or working on vehicle	Store equipment in proper compartment, drive safely, first aid kit, fire extinguisher are required, gloves required when working on trucks, use proper tools.
Falls, sprains, strains from walking on uneven or slippery ground and from falling objects, cuts, blisters, bruises and scratches from walking, eye injuries	Hard hat required, 8" high top boots, awareness of surroundings, vest to carry necessary equipment, leaving hands free, work clothing required, gloves optional, carry first aid kit, safety goggles optional
Insect bites, bee stings and snake bites	First aid kit, 8" top boots, long sleeve shirt, and portable radio.
Lightning	Stay away from open exposures, ridge tops, tall lone trees, rock outcrops, turn radio off.
Heat exhaustion and sunburn	Carry and drink plenty of water, use sun block, carry first aid kit, use long sleeve shirt, hard hat.
Hypothermia-frost bite	Use proper clothing for weather conditions, fitness, portable radio, first aid kit, fire starting equip.
Cuts, sprains, strains from equipment use	Common sense, awareness of tape and other sharp edges, control rewind tension, cover hatchet head, don't carry too much equipment, use vest to distribute load, gloves and safety goggles optional.
Winter travel	Use 4-wheel drive or chains before you're in trouble, reduce speed to fit conditions, extra food & clothing.
Using map machine	Training in proper use and settings on machine, care in handling large sheets of paper or mylar, proper use of paper cutter. Be aware of fumes from the chemicals. See MSDS for developer chemicals. Keep fingers, hands, hair, loose clothing, etc. away from machine's moving parts.
